TRUSTEES ANNUAL REPORT

YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2014

The trustees, who are also directors for the purposes of company law, present their report and the audited financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2014.

Reference and Administrative Details

Reference and administrative details are shown in the schedule of members of the board and professional advisers on page 1 of the financial statements.

Objects of the Charity

The Charity is a Company limited by guarantee and was incorporated 13 December 2000. The Charity was established under a Memorandum of Association, which established the objects and powers of the charitable company and is governed under its Articles of Association. Under those Articles, the members of the Management Board are elected at the Annual General Meeting.

The Directors confirm that they have paid due regard to the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit and have strived to ensure that the Charity's activities reflect this.

Review of Activities

The Company is a Charity established to provide youth services and activities for young people (age 10-25) living in Felixstowe and the surrounding villages. Our town centre youth hub provides a safe environment where young people can meet with qualified youth workers. We promote the welfare of all young people through supportive relationships and positive experiences designed to enhance their personal and social development. Our target group is inclusive of young people disadvantaged in some way, or who have difficulties in their relationships with their peers, family, school or authority generally. We offer a varied programme of activities and social opportunities, together with one-to-one mentoring and information, advice and guidance on a number of issues.

The Trustees have paid due regard to guidance issued by the Charity Commission in deciding what activities the Charity should undertake.

Investment Policy

Under the Memorandum and Articles of Association, the Charity has the power to make any investments which the Trustees see fit.

Achievements and performance

The net increase in reserves for the year amounted to £4,120. This is the difference between an increase in unrestricted fund of £3,373 and an increase of restricted fund of £747. At 31 December 2014 the unrestricted reserves were £7,407.

Progress

The Project, in common with many other charities, continued to find the economic climate very challenging we have however despite losing a major funder been fortunate in securing a number of smaller grants and with good management of the finances have remained in a financially stable position.

We are grateful to all those individuals and organisations that have given use support (see our supporters list). We were during 2014 chosen by the Mayor of Felixstowe Councillor Graham Newman as one of his charities for the year. We have had a number of enjoyable fundraising events a number as a result of being the Mayors Charity.

The Directors wish to record their continuing thanks to the staff and volunteers for their dedication to the project.

Shez Southernwood continues as Project Manager, bringing vision and new ideas to the Project. During the year she has been supported by her team of staff and volunteers. We have been able develop the role of our Project Administrator Wendy O'Connor to include fundraising and an increased responsibility for financial matters. We have increased our number of volunteers, including young volunteers which is particularly rewarding.

The Project has continued to provide a range of services to the young people in the Felixstowe area, tailored to meet their expectations, within the limitations of funding. During 2014 we had 660 individual young people access our services, with a total number of contacts of 6500. These figures are up on last year and the main reason for this is the expansion of the work to include young people in year 6 and our increased work with young people who have a disability. Level Two is highly regarded within the Community. The following is illustrative of the activities and services provided by the Project in 2014:- One-to-One Mentoring; Health Matters; After-school and evening open-access sessions; Holiday activities and trips; work with unemployed young people; working with young people with a disability and Detached Youth Work.

The organisation has a comprehensive set of policy documents covering all aspects of its operation. The Project continues to operate successfully from the Youth Hub in Cobbold Road.

Reserves Policy

It is the Policy of the Charity that the total funds, including those that have been designated for a specific use during the period that the reserves fund covers, should be built up to and maintained at a level equivalent to three month's expenditure. The Management Board and the Directors consider this to be good practice.

Future Strategy

Felixstowe Youth Development Group is the parent organisation which currently operates the Level Two Youth Project. We will continue to provide a wide range of services for young people, based upon their needs. The desirability of securing more earned or commissioned income, rather than reliance on grant-giving bodies, is recognised and strenuous efforts will be made to secure alternative funding. We have recently been successful in reaching the second round of bidding for lottery funding and will be working on this bid during the first half of 2015.

We remain committed to ensuring the Charity continues to meet the need of all young people between 10-25 years.

The Group's policy remains to encourage the professional development of staff and volunteers. As funds permit, opportunities will be offered for training courses and conferences. In-house training is also cascaded to staff and volunteers. Volunteers are given the opportunity to obtain a recognised certificate. As in the previous year the Directors are committed to ensuring we pay at least the Living Wage to all staff.

In the coming year the Directors are committed to consolidating and expanding the work at the Youth Hub. We will encourage other agencies working with young people to engage with us to provide support and services to young people. The Directors and Management Board remain fully committed to the immediate and long-term future of Felixstowe Youth Development Group and Level Two Youth Project.

Trustees' responsibilities in relation to the financial statements

Company law requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year, which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charitable company and of the incoming resources and application of resources, including the income and expenditure, of the charitable company for that period. In preparing these financial statements, the trustees are required to:

- · select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- observe the methods and principles in the Charities SORP;
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- state whether applicable UK Accounting Standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements;
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charitable company will continue in operation.

The trustees are responsible for keeping adequate accounting records that disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charitable company and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charitable company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting
